Description of Placement

The Old Age Psychiatry department comprises of two acute wards. Rowan ward which is for functional illness and Cedars ward which is for continuing care for people with dementia. There is also an ECT suite. Oldham has a day hospital, Orchard House, which supports functional patients in the community. This is situated off-site in Royton (5 minute drive). There is a memory clinic which all consultants in the Old Age department provide in-put. There is access to psychological services within the department. There is an established Older Peoples RAID team with a designated consultant. The post is a sector post.

The trainee whilst in post will have the opportunity to work on both wards, have supervised clinics and home visits. They will have the opportunity to spend time with the RAID consultant if this is of interest.

Roles and Responsibilities of the Trainee

The trainee will be responsible for the day to day management of patients on the ward. They will be supported in this by an FY1 and there is another CT/GPVTS based on the Old Age Wards. They will have supervised out-patient clinics, memory clinics and the opportunity to experience home visits. They will be expected to complete mandatory training for the post.

Core Clinical Work *Include details of where this will be carried out, type of assessments and therapies for which the doctor in training will be responsible (all experience must be appropriate to the level of training provided)*

Ward rounds – attendance at weekly ward rounds. Opportunity to develop management and leadership skills with in this. All ward rounds will be supervised a consultant.
Ward work – day to day management of patients on the ward. This will include management of physical and mental health. Clerking in of new patients including risk assessment and physical examination. Completing discharge summaries to GP's following a patients admission.
Out-patient clinics – supervised clinics to begin with depending on experience moving to independent assessments of new and follow-up patients with discussion with consultant about management plans.
Home-visits – supervised community visits, full assessment of patients within the home setting and management plans.
Memory clinic – assessment of patients in memory clinic, supervised initially and then independent depending on level of experience. Experience completing cognitive tests and interpreting MRI/CT scan reports and giving a diagnosis of dementia.

1-3, 6, 7, 13, 18, 19	Through ward rounds, clinics, home visits and on-call the trainee will have opportunity to develop the knowledge and skills to work towards and achieve (depending on level of experience) these ILO's. There will be time during the placement to complete WPBA's including CBD's, Mini-ACE and ACE.
4	There will be plenty of opportunity to develop skills to assess risk through ward round reviews and seeing patients in clinic. On-call the trainee will be involved in assessing risk out of hours with support of senior's and working with the RAID team. They will gain experience in the application of the Mental Health Act through ward work and assessing patients detained under a section 136.
5	Depending on the stage of training the trainee will attend a Balint group within Pennine Care or will be allocated a psychotherapy case depending on the training needs of the trainee.
8, 17	The trainee will be attending weekly journal clubs as part of the local teaching and will also get chance to present. As part of regular teaching the trainee will also have the opportunity to present a case.
9, 11, 12, 19	Opportunity to develop in this ILO will be incorporated into weekly supervision.
10, 11	The trainee will be expected to complete an audit or get involved in a quality improvement project depending on their level of experience and interest.
14, 15	The trainee will have the opportunity to lead ward rounds, developing leadership skills. Depending on interest and experience they can attend departmental development meetings and get involved in any development projects that are on-going. Through-out the weekly time-table there are opportunities to develop team-working skills. The trainee will be expected to liaise with both the in-patient team and out-patient team, when needed.

The trainee is encourage to spend time in other areas of psychiatry which are of interest to them during this post.
