Description of Placement

This is a placement based at Early intervention team at Leigh sports village with first episode psychosis in children and adults aged from 14 to 65 years in the Wigan Borough. The medical team consists of a full-time consultant, There is a medical secretary attached to this team. The trainee will be part of an Early intervention team that will be responsible for the assessment and management of patients with first episode psychosis. The trainee will work as part of a multidisciplinary team comprising of mental health nurses, psychologists, OT and STR workers.

During this placement, the trainee will have extensive learning opportunities in the assessment and management of patient's with first episode psychosis. The trainee will participate in a first on-call rota that would further enhance their exposure to emergency psychiatry under clinical supervision.

The placement allows trainees to develop skills of assessing patients with a variety of acutely Psychotic presentations under supervision developing confidence at assessing risk/managing patients and developing discharge plans.

The team consists of Band 6 nurse practitioners, Band 7 Team Manager, CBTp therapists, a Clinical Psychologist and one full time consultants covering Children and adults aged 14 to 65. There is also opportunity to spend time with the CAMHS part of the service to join work with children with psychosis.

Roles and Responsibilities of the Trainee

- The trainee will provide medical input in to the patients under EIT under supervision. This would include assessment of mental and physical health of patients and participation in regular multidisciplinary case management meetings.
- The trainee will have the opportunity to formulate and present cases during the outpatient reviews and will be expected to provide written documentation of medical and psychiatric examinations.
- They will also be expected to provide clinic letters to GP's in a timely manner.

Mainly provide medical input to EIT patients under supervision and on-call duties.
 The core clinical work will be carried out at Claire house and Atherleigh park hospital out patient's

reviews. This work would be history taking, mental state examination and risk/management plans. Trainees will be expected to use their medical knowledge in relation to assessing patients with first episode psychosis appropriate to their level of training.
