Description of Placement

The placement would mainly be based in the community in both North and South Sefton. The trainee would lead clinics and also assess/manage adult patients with learning disabilities in the community. There may be occasional inpatient duties if adults with learning disabilities are admitted to the Park Unit in Southport. There will be opportunity to attend monthly LD specific teaching at Hollins Park Hospital and lead in organising this teaching (under supervision). They will also be able to attend the Tuesday Local Academic Day at Ashworth Hospital where they will gain experience in chairing academic meetings. The role would be supervised by the consultant of the team and they will be supported by secretarial staff and members of a diverse multi-disciplinary team consisting of nursing, psychology, SALT, physiotherapy and OT.

Roles and Responsibilities of the Trainee

The role would mainly be based in the community in both North and South Sefton. The trainee would lead clinics and also assess/manage adult patients with learning disabilities in the community. There may be occasional inpatient duties if adults with learning disabilities are admitted to the Park unit in Southport.

The trainee would also attend the MDT on Wednesday mornings in Southport.

Teaching/Academic Experience

Trainees are required to attend the monthly, one day NWLD Teaching at Hollins Park. They will be expected to contribute to this teaching by presenting one per academic term. They will also be given the opportunity to attend the LAP at Ashworth which occurs most Tuesdays. The will gain experience of chairing as part of the rota for this meeting. They will be encouraged to attend external training eg. ADOS/DISCO.



The higher trainee will be encouraged to audit one area of practice and present this at the NWLD teaching. Our department is currently involved in the 100,000 Genome Project and there may be scope to become involved in this research.
