Description of Placement

Ancora House is a Tier 4 inpatient adolescent psychiatric service offering both bed based and non bed based interventions. The core trainee will be predominantly working in the two wards- Coral ward and Indigo ward

Roles and Responsibilities of the Trainee

- Psychiatric assessments and reviews of young people admitted to Ancora house under supervision
- Risk assessments and management under supervision
- Management of psychiatric emergencies under supervision
- Assess and manage physical health of young people admitted to Ancora house
- Duty rota at Bowmere
- Out of hour oncall

Core Clinical Work *Include details of where this will be carried out, type of assessments and therapies for which the doctor in training will be responsible (all experience must be appropriate to the level of training provided)*

Ancora House is a purpose built inpatient psychiatric unit for adolescents. It consists of two wardscoral, an acute assessment and treatment ward and Indigo ward, treatment ward. The core trainee will join the medical team consisting of consultant adolescent psychiatrists, higher trainee in CAMHS and Foundation year trainee. In addition the MDT consists of nurse consultant, psychologists, family therapists, occupational therapists and nursing team

The core trainee will be responsible for psychiatric assessments and reviews of a proportion of young people admitted to Ancora house under supervision of Dr Mandara. The core trainee and foundation trainee are responsible for monitoring the physical health of young people. The job provides an opportunity to work with young people and families, liaise with other agencies and partners.

The daytime duty rota covers the inpatient wards at Bowmere Hospital, MHA nominated deputy work, supporting MH Liaison Team and the Accident and Emergency Department at the Countess of Chester Hospital.

Intended Learning Objectives *Indicate how the post will meet the trainee's curriculum requirements as identified in the portfolio*

The HEE North West Core Psychiatry Training Scheme provides Doctors in Training the opportunity to undertake a three year programme with clinical posts to cover the clinical aspects of the curriculum. These placements are in a variety of settings, teaching centres and district general hospitals, covering both urban and rural populations.

The doctor in training will be expected to work in different clinical placements to achieve experience with in-patients and patients within community and in out-patient clinics. The clinical experience is complemented by opportunities in other aspects of training provided locally within training placements and centrally by the School of Psychiatry and Health Education North West (HENW) Mersey.

During the three year programme, doctors in training will be expected to meet all of the Independent Learning Outcomes (ILOs) in the Curricula set out by the Royal College of Psychiatrists. The ILOs are shown at the end of this document. Please note that it might not be possible to complete all ILOs in every post, but trainees should ensure that they are able to evidence them all during the three year programme.

Supervision Arrangements

There is weekly supervision with the clinical supervisor (Please see attached timetable), in addition to ongoing clinical supervision and teaching.

There will be a minimum of three meetings across the placement with the educational supervisor.

Teaching/Academic Experience

All Doctors in training have the opportunity to attend and participate in the local MRCPsych teaching, held on a Wednesday afternoon, and attend the quarterly Grand Round

The MRCPsych course provides opportunities for Doctors in Training to present:

- A Case presentation
- A Journal Club
- 555 Presentation

The course also includes an expert led session on a different topic each week.

Doctors in Training are also encouraged to participate in the supervision and teaching of Undergraduate Medical Students.

Opportunities are available for all trainees that wish to participate in research projects, and to lead and participate in Trust wide audits.

Audit/Research Opportunities

All trainees are expected to participate/complete and audit project, and they are supported in this by the Trust audit department.

There are a number of consultants involved in research within CWP who offer opportunities to trainees, and can also offer advice and support to trainees when conducting research.

Management Opportunities

Doctors in Training are a vital part of the MDT and are encouraged to participate in departmental meetings.
