Description of Placement

The Ellesmere Port & Neston Adult Mental Health Services Team (EP&N AMHS) is a community adult mental health team providing secondary mental health services to people registered with GPs in Ellesmere Port and Neston. The team is multidisciplinary and includes mental health nurses, social workers, 2 part-time psychologists, a psychotherapist and a senior occupational therapist. The team supports people with severe and enduring mental health needs with a history of associated risk. The team is based at Cherrybank Resource Centre in the centre of Ellesmere Port.

Roles and Responsibilities of the Trainee

Conducting assessment and follow-up appointments with patients referred to EP&N AMHS. This work will be supported by care coordinators and the consultant. The trainee may also undertake other AMHS work such as medication reviews, home visits and providing advice and support to members of the team etc. Consultant supervision will be by Dr Hisham Gaballa. The trainee will also be part of the daytime duty rota covering Bowmere Hospital and the Out of Hours rota.

Core Clinical Work Include details of where this will be carried out, type of assessments and therapies for which the doctor in training will be responsible (all experience must be appropriate to the level of training provided)

Outpatient clinics are at Cherrybank. The trainee will carry out initial assessments, including history taking and mental state examination, on people referred to EP&N AMHS by the Single Point of Access (SPA) Team, or transferred from other teams. Where necessary the trainee will review follow up patients in the outpatient clinic. The trainee will work collaboratively with patients to produce person-centred treatment plans which may include medical treatment, referral for psychological therapy, regrading patients to CPA and referral for OT assessments. Home visits may be carried out in urgent situations or in cases where people are unable to attend outpatient clinics.

Patients referred to the EP&N AMHS team have a range of needs including psychotic illnesses, e.g. schizophrenia, schizoaffective disorders and delusional disorders; mood disorders including severe depression and bipolar disorder; people with severe personality disorders associated with significant risk and people with complex needs, i.e. severe mental illness with comorbid substance use and psychological needs.

The daytime duty rota covers the inpatient wards at Bowmere Hospital, MHA nominated deputy work, supporting MH Liaison Team and the Accident and Emergency Department at the Countess of Chester Hospital. The trainee is also expected to contribute to the Weekly multidisciplinary team meeting.

The HEE North West General Psychiatry Higher Training Scheme provides Doctors in Training the opportunity to undertake a three year programme with clinical posts to cover the clinical aspects of the curriculum. These placements are in a variety of settings, teaching centres and district general hospitals, covering both urban and rural populations.

The doctor in training will be expected to work in different clinical placements to achieve experience with in-patients and patients within community and in out-patient clinics. The clinical experience is complemented by opportunities in other aspects of training provided locally within training placements and centrally by the School of Psychiatry and Health Education North West (HENW) Mersey.

During the three year programme, doctors in training will be expected to meet all of the Independent Learning Outcomes (ILOs) in the Curricula set out by the Royal College of Psychiatrists. The ILOs are shown at the end of this document. Please note that it might not be possible to complete all ILOs in every post, but trainees should ensure that they are able to evidence them all during the three year programme.

Out of hours duties as per Junior Doctor rota including out of hours 5-9pm and night duties with supervision from higher trainees and consultants on call as required.

Supervision Arrangements

There is weekly supervision with the clinical supervisor (Please see attached timetable), in addition to

ongoing clinical supervision and teaching.

There will be a minimum of three meetings across the placement with the educational supervisor.

Teaching/Academic Experience

All Doctors in training have the opportunity to attend and participate in the local MRCPsych teaching, held on a Wednesday afternoon, and attend the quarterly Grand Round

The course also includes an expert led session on a different topic each week.

Doctors in Training are also encouraged to participate in the supervision and teaching of Undergraduate Medical Students.

Opportunities are available for all trainees that wish to participate in research projects, and to lead and participate in Trust wide audits.

Audit/Research Opportunities

All trainees are expected to participate/complete and audit project, and they are supported in this by the Trust audit department.

There are a number of consultants involved in research within CWP who offer opportunities to trainees, and can also offer advice and support to trainees when conducting research.

Management Opportunities

Doctors in Training are a vital part of the MDT and are encouraged to participate in departmental meetings.
