Description of Placement

The Cheshire and Wirral Partnership NHS Trust (CWP) was established as a specialist NHS Trust in April 2002 and achieved Foundation Trust status in 2007. It provides comprehensive mental health services in close partnership and collaboration with Social Care Departments, Clinical Commissioning Groups, Hospital NHS Trusts, user and carer groups and other external agencies.

In addition to adult mental health services, the Trust also provides child and adolescent mental health services, older adult mental health services and learning disability services for the populations of Cheshire and Wirral, approximately 1 million. CWP also provides learning disability services in Trafford. CWP Trust Headquarters are based in Chester.

Our services comprise:

- Adult mental health including out-patient and in-patient facilities, assertive outreach and crisis teams, mental health resource centres, community teams, A&E liaison, day care and rehabilitation
- Older persons' mental health including out-patient and in-patient facilities, community teams, specialty memory support and A&E liaison.
- Child and adolescent mental health including a regional unit, out-patient and in-patient facilities, community teams and specialist 16-19 teams.
- Psychology including psychological therapy services, psychosexual services and psychotherapy.
- Learning disabilities including out-patient and in-patient facilities assessment, treatment and rehabilitation services, respite facilities and community teams.
- Neuro- developmental diagnostic and post diagnosis support, advice and consultation
- Acquired brain Injury Services
- Community physical health services and Children's services.

The trust services are organized into four care groups with the Learning Disability Assessment and Treatment service being a part of the Learning Disability, Neurodevelopmental Disorder and Acquired Brain Injury care group.

Dr. Odiyoor is an experienced trainer at both CT and ST level with nearly 9 years of teaching experience, an MD degree, experience as a clinical researcher and over 9 year experience as a clinical manager.

The post holder will work flexibly between Greenways Assessment & Treatment Unit, Macclesfield and the Eastway Assesment and Treatment unit, Chester. The multi-disciplinary team structure in Greenways and Eastway assessment and treatment unit is as follows

The MDT is complemented by appropriate numbers of senior practitioners, staff nurses, associate practitioners and Clinical support workers. There are also CT trainees at both the units and GP input into Greenways A&T unit.

Referrals

Eastway and Greenways Inpatient Treatment and Assessment Unit are a nine and twelve bedded units respectively. They cater for the population from the Cheshire and Greater Manchester area. To be eligible for service patients must have significant learning disabilities i.e. an IQ of approximately 70 or below and significant impairment of social functioning. The most common presenting problems are challenging behaviour associated with mental illness, development disorders (e.g. Autism or ADHD), epilepsy, and profound or multiple disability.

Roles and Responsibilities of the Trainee

Trainees are expected to become an integral part of the inpatient multidisciplinary teams, working closely together with staff from all disciplines. They will also become involved in much inter-agency work. Under supervision they will take an active role in admitting, assessing, and providing treatment to patients on the inpatient units.

The duties will include the following:

- To contribute to the multi-disciplinary assessment and treatment function of the inpatient teams. This will include giving advice to other team members and the primary care and social services regarding team patients when this is clinically indicated.
- To respond to urgent referrals for admission to inpatient units in liaison with the Consultant Psychiatrist.
- The higher trainee will be expected to work in close liaison with the wider Community Health Teams, Social Service Teams, provider services, primary and secondary health services, service user/carer and advocacy groups and other statutory and voluntary agencies.
- Trainees will have the opportunity to develop their leadership and management skills.
- There will also be opportunities for them to prepare, under supervision, medico-legal reports, and reports to the Hospital Managers or Mental Health Review Tribunals. They will also have the opportunity to represent the Consultant Psychiatrist, if necessary, in reporting and attending Managers' Appeals and mental Health Tribunals.
- Trainees will attend the weekly academic meeting and be expected to contribute to teaching
 and training sessions. The higher trainee will provide supervision to junior medical
 staff/students as and when appropriate. The postholder will be encouraged to take part in the
 teaching of students, junior doctors and other staff.

- Trainees will have protected time for research & audit and also for special interest sessions.
 The trainee will have access to a widerange of academic activities undertaken through the
 Center for Autism, Neurodevelopmental disorders and Id (CANDDID) to enrich their
 experience.
- Trainees will take part in an on-call rota during evenings and week-ends, as well as night time, together with trainees from General Adult Psychiatry and Psychiatry for the Elderly.

They will receive regular weekly supervision and clinical support and supervision at other times during the week as required.

Previous CT trainees have given very positive feedback and have clearly enjoyed and benefited from the experience of working here.

The trainee will engage in the following core clinical work:

- To contribute to the multi-disciplinary assessment and treatment function of the inpatient teams.
- The treatment modalities that the trainee will gain experience will include pharmacological treatments, psychological treatment, behavioural formulations and development of positive behaviour support plans, understanding communication and OT assessments.

The trainee will also be involved in giving advice to other team members and the primary care and social services regarding team patients when this is clinically indicated.

- To respond to urgent referrals for admission to inpatient units in liaison with the Consultant Psychiatrist and be involved in risk assessments, capacity assessments and participate in mental health legal assessments as part of their training.
- The higher trainee will be expected to work in close liaison with the wider Community Health Teams, Social Service Teams, provider services, primary and secondary health services, service user/carer and advocacy groups and other statutory and voluntary agencies.

There is on call work for all posts sufficient for trainees to attain the recommendation the RCPsych guidance for minimum number of on call duties.

Academic Activities (These should include case conferences/Journal Clubs/Lectures etc)

CWP offers a weekly Post-Graduate academic program which includes the MRCPsych syllabus for doctors in training. The teaching offers a wide range of subjects within Psychiatric Medicine including General Adult, Older People, Learning Disability, Substance Misuse, Eating Disorders, Liaison and Forensic Psychiatry.

The teaching is delivered through a range of methods including case presentations, journal clubs, and expert led sessions. All participants, from trainees through to Consultants, are encouraged to participate, engage, and lead the teaching. External experts are also invited to teach at times. The program aims to provide an environment for academic, clinical and professional development, as well as helping the junior trainees to prepare for their exams. In addition, the doctors are encouraged to make use of the library facilities to read widely on topics associated with their clinical work.

Cheshire and Wirral Partnership NHS Foundation Trust has an excellent educational department and trust library. The trainee will be expected to attend and participate in the regional LD educational teaching program through the NW LD forum. There is a full range of audit presentations, journal clubs and academic lectures.

The care group has setup the Centre for Autism, Neurodevelopmental disorders and Intellectual Disabilities (CANDDID) to promote a wide range of academic activities. As part of this an MSc programme in NDD and ID has been developed with Chester university. The trainee will be encouraged to consider this or other similar academic activity as part of their training.

Facilities

Doctors in Training are provided with internet access and training on the Carenotes electronic database. Doctors are also able to use the electronic Library facilities, which include access to journal and online teaching resources.

The trainee will have access to desk, computer and appropriate admin support to organise diaries via outlook.

Cheshire and Wirral Partnership NHS Foundation Trust have a peripatetic librarian who offers support to all staff of CWP. In addition, the post holder will be welcomed to use the library facilities at Elm House.

Supervision Arrangements

Clinical and educational supervision will be provided weekly on a Monday with Dr. Odiyoor

Teaching/Academic Experience

CWP offers a weekly Post-Graduate academic program which includes the MRCPsych syllabus for doctors in training. The teaching offers a wide range of subjects within Psychiatric Medicine including General Adult, Older People, Learning Disability, Substance Misuse, Eating Disorders, Liaison and Forensic Psychiatry.

The postgraduate teaching programme provides opportunities for Doctors in Training to present:

- A Case presentation
- A Journal Club
- 555 Presentation

The course also includes an expert led session on a different topic each week.

Doctors in Training of level ST4-ST6 are provided with the opportunity to chair the event to provide additional management opportunities.

The trainee will also have the opportunity to provide supervision to junior medical staff/students as and when appropriate.

The trainee will be expected to

- Participate in undergraduate and postgraduate clinical teaching.
- Participate in the training of other disciplines.
- Provide educational supervision of trainees and other disciplines.
- Take part in continuing medical education within statutory limits. Medical students are placed within the team and the trainee will have opportunities to participate in teaching.

There are very good links with the regional University Medical School training scheme. There are opportunities for teaching and OSCE examination. Trainees will be encouraged to undertake appropriate training in teaching skills.

Audit/Research Opportunities

CWP has an active R&D department led by professor Taj Nathan and has active research and academic links with local universities including Chester University. The Learning Disability, Neuro-developmental disorder and Acquired Brain Injury Care Group is actively promoting the development of the research agenda and the post holder will be encouraged to engage in research activities supported by our academic and research department.

The post holder will have access to the internet and intranet and to library resources at the Postgraduate Centre.

The trainee will be expected to participate in audit of a high standard. The trainee will be expected to develop links with the trust audit department. Previous audits have been presented at the Royal College of Psychiatry Learning Disability Conference and if possible the trainee will be expected to participate in this.

The caregroup has setup the Centre for Autism, Neurodevelopmental disorders and Intellectual Disabilities (CANDDID) to promote a wide range of research activities. There are a number of ongoing regional and national research programmes through CANDDID. The trainee will be encouraged to either develop their own research ideas or to take part in ongoing projects to enhance their research skills.

The Cheshire and Wirral Partnership NHS Foundation Trust provide free access to the Royal College of Psychiatrists CPD Online learning modules.

Management Opportunities

Cheshire and Wirral Partnership NHS Foundation Trust has an active QI development initiative across its services. The trainee will be expected to be actively involved in service development and quality improvement initiatives.

Post-holder will be expected to

- Gain skills and contribute to clinical governance and take responsibility for monitoring standards.
- Participate in clinical audit and quality improvement activities.
- Participate in service/team evaluation and the planning of future service developments.

The trainee will have opportunities to participate in multi-agency meeting with the possibility of chairing some meetings.

The trainee will have an opportunity to develop an understanding of the principles behind the management of LD services and service delivery via opportunities to observe management meetings with supervisor. The trainee will also be supported to develop an understanding of the different service models and their implications for health services for people with LD via opportunities to observe regional and national meetings with the supervisor.

Other/Additional Experience

Dr Odiyoor has a number of trust, regional and national management roles. The trainee will have an opportunity to develop an understanding of the principles behind the management of LD services and service delivery via opportunities to observe management meetings with supervisor. The trainee will also be supported to develop an understanding of the different service models and their implications for health services for people with LD via opportunities to observe regional and national meetings with the supervisor.

Dr. Odiyoor also has an interest and training in Neuropsychiatry. This would enable the trainee to gain an understanding around interphase between neurological /neuropsychiatric conditions with ID and NDD.
